Christ is Born...for You!





Pastor Jake Dyrhaug

"The angel said to them, 'Don't be afraid!' I have good news for you, a message that will fill everyone with joy. Today your Savior, Christ the Lord, was born in David's city."

Luke 2:10-11

I remember visiting the traditional site of the stable and manger where Jesus was born— Bethlehem, David's Royal City. I wonder how our Jewish guide, Deana, is today, and how the Palestinian Christian friends we met in Bethlehem in the West Bank are, if they are all safe. When we hear about the troubles of the world which always seem to assail us, including the terrible violence in Israel and the Gaza Strip and Lebanon (which is over 30% Christian and celebrates Christmas too), we find ourselves wondering, why doesn't the Prince of Peace reign in people's hearts fully yet? One thing I'm convinced of, it has to be God, not human beings, who will do that fully. God's Kingdom will come, "indeed without our praying for it", as Martin Luther writes in the Small Catechism.


Luther saw that the main message of Christmas is that Christ is born FOR YOU. Martin Luther even came for a surprise visit on our recent Discipleship Sunday (thank you, Pastor Larry, for accompanying him that day!) He says, "No matter where you're reading in the Bible, faith is the first mystery you should recognize... Faith is not a natural work apart

from God's grace, as the Scripture clearly teaches. Rather the right kind of faith, the kind that flows from grace and that God's Word demands, is firmly believing that Christ was born for you. His birth is yours and occurred for your benefit. For the gospel teaches that Christ was born for our benefit and that everything he did and suffered was for us. (The angel doesn't say...) 'a Savior was born,' but rather 'your Savior, Christ the Lord, was born in David's city.' With these words, you can clearly see that he was born for all of us. He doesn't say, 'a Savior was born,' but rather 'your Savior, Christ the Lord, was born.' In the same way, he doesn't say, 'I have good news,' rather 'I have good news for you.' For you! 'I have good news for you, a message that will fill everyone with joy.' This joy is for everyone who has this kind of faith" (By Faith Alone, Devotional Readings from Martin Luther Updated in Today's Language). More than dreaming of a White Christmas, this is the main thing.

Come by for the Living Nativity this year and experience this message portrayed by live actors and animals at the Coburn's parking lot once again December 7 from 2-5:00 p.m.! Christmas in a Barn services at will be at Noon, 1:30 and 3:00 this year, with Christmas Eve candlelight services at 5:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. at Living Waters. Come and marvel in this mystery with us that Christ is born for you!

President's Update


